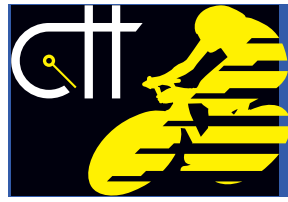

The Chairman moves between the sub-committee meetings as subject matter dictates.

## STAFFING 2017

As Stewart Smith settled into his role, Nick Sharpe reduced his hours and it became clear that we needed a full-time administrator to make up the quota. Sally Withey joined us in May and has settled in well dealing with queries, website, minutes and other support roles. Nick's role has taken many more hours than he anticipated, or was contracted to, this year mostly due to a substantial amount of additional work for his professional expertise. It is likely that we will need to officially increase Nick's hours in 2018 as the requirements for legal issues continues. After completing the initial ground work, Alison Torode passed course measurement and risk assessment to experts in their field. The short-term appointment of Martyn Heritage-Owen, an IT expert, saw not only

## FINANCE

The published Cycling Time Trials accounts cover the year to 31 March 2017, and for comparative purposes show the year to 31 March 2016. The accounts for the year show a surplus of income over expenditure of £7,000 compared to the previous year's surplus of £2,000. The material factors in this result when compared with the previous year are:

### Income:

Overall, income increased by £15,000:

- Type A levies fell by £3,000 representing around 1,500 rides.
- Type B levies fell by over £14,000 which resulted from a decrease of around 7,000 rides.
- Subscription (affiliation and advertising fees) increased by over £9,000.
- Handbook deficit increased by £6,000
- Online charges which were not reported separately last year accounted for £30,000 increase. Last year these were used to subsidise some of the website entry development costs. It is estimated these accounted for around £25,000 last year.

the backlog of start and result sheets uploaded to the website, but those covering the 2017 season too and our thanks go to Martyn for attacking the role in a professional manner that has seen many organisers benefiting from his help and advice as they used the website process for the first time. Moving forward, Sally Withey will be encompassing this job in her full-time role.

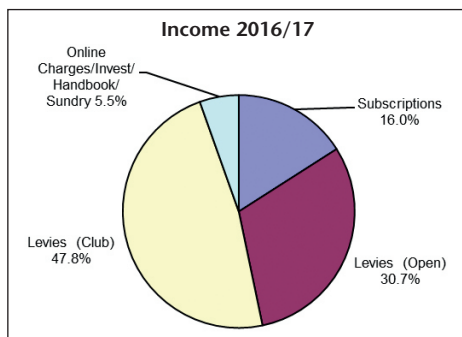

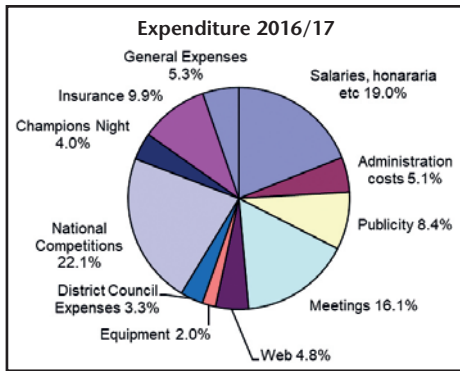
## EXPENDITURE

Overall, expenditure increased by nearly £10,000:

- National administration expenses overall fell by £7,000. Salaries fell prior to the appointment of a new Administration Assistant in May 2017. The Boards' travel and accommodation increased with the addition of co-opted Board members from Scotland.

The other significant changes are drug testing up by £17,000, medals and trophies £7,000 which were offset by a reduction in costs for workshops of £5,000.

The reserves as at 31 March 2017 therefore will be £7,000 above last year's at around £500,000 which would cover the loss of income for over a year or cover over a year's expenditure.



## MEMBERSHIP AND PARTICIPATION

The number of affiliated clubs currently stands at 1588, an increase of 239 compared with last year. Of these, 564 have registered to carry advertising, an increase of 86 compared to last year.

For the financial year to 31 March 2017, there has been a fall in the overall number of rides. In Type A events with nearly 66,000 (down by 2%) and a fall in rides in Type B events with 103,000 (down by 6%).

A working party has been setup to review the trend in the number of rides and events over the district, the intention being to produce an action plan in 2018 to address concerns.

## INSURANCE

For 2016/17 CTT renewed its insurance using the same insurance broker, Romero Insurance Brokers Ltd. The policy is underwritten by Aspen Risk Management Limited. The total limit of indemnity is £10,000,000. "Competitor to competitor" cover remains an important element of the policy and provides indemnity should a competitor be involved in an accident involving another competitor whilst participating in a time trial held under CTT's Rules and Regulations.

## SAFETY OF THE SPORT

Three riders were fatally injured whilst competing in time trials during 2017. In separate incidents, John Stewart (South Pennine RC), John Durey (VC Deal) and Ray Dare (Kingston Phoenix RC) were each involved in a collision with a motor vehicle and sadly died as a result of their injuries.

### Accident reporting

The total number of reported accidents in CTT events in 2017 was 112, as opposed to 73 reported accidents in 2016, which represents an increase of 65%. 71 accidents were reported in open (Type A) events and 41 in club (Type B) events.

Whereas it is worrying to see an increase in the number of reported accidents, from the nature of the accidents reported, it is understood that this is likely due to an increased vigilance in the reporting of accidents that occur in CTT events.

It is essential that all accidents are reported to the National Secretary (Legal & Corporate) and the appropriate District Secretary as soon as possible after the event. Should an accident occur, copies of the following documents should be retained as they may be needed by CTT's insurers:

1. a copy of the police notification form sent to the police;
2. any letter of acknowledgement from the police;
3. the start sheet;
4. the signing on and signing off sheet;
5. the "on the day" risk assessment;
6. any warning notice given to the competitors on the day (usually displayed alongside the signing on sheet).

Accidents should be reported using the standard CTT form. This has been agreed with CTT's insurers and is

available from either the District Secretary, National Secretary (Legal & Corporate) or can be downloaded from the CTT website. **Please note that there will be a revised form which should be used in 2018.**

Ideally accident reports should be submitted to the National Secretary (Legal & Corporate) by email to [nick.sharpe@cyclingtimestrials.org.uk](mailto:nick.sharpe@cyclingtimestrials.org.uk) or alternatively by post to the address in the current CTT handbook.

### Cycle event signage

Nineteen affiliated clubs which had never previously promoted time trials took advantage of the offer to purchase a "Starter Pack" of cycle event signs at a special rate of £40 (to include carriage). Thirty-three further clubs have replenished their stock with new signage and/or race numbers. The Board of Directors see this as a further opportunity to continue with the offer in 2018.

If your club needs signs please order well in advance. At peak times the manufacture and processing of signs can take several weeks. ## WELFARE OF THE SPORT

### Regulation 25 and Medical Control

For the first time in 2017, CTT worked together with UK Anti-Doping to provide an "Outreach" stand at two CTT events, which was manned by representatives from UKAD who provided advice on anti-doping matters and handed out UKAD branded products, the purpose of which is to raise awareness of doping in sport and how a rider can inadvertently fall foul of the anti-doping regulations, possibly as a result of taking an "over the counter" remedy or

even as a result of taking a medicine prescribed by their GP. The Outreach initiative is designed to educate and was received extremely well by those who attended it. It is planned to expand on this during 2018.

Anti-Doping collections were carried out at various events, including National Championships during 2017. In all 67 samples have been collected. CTT has been notified of one adverse analytical finding.

In all cases the randomly selected individuals were very co-operative.

It is very important to note that it is the individual rider's responsibility to check if they are required for Doping Control. Riders should always return to the event HQ on completion of their ride, and if required, report to Doping Control. Importantly, failure to report renders the individual liable to be disqualified from the event and/or further disciplinary action.

We would remind riders to check with their doctor, if they are taking medication, that the use of such medication does not contravene the Anti-Doping Regulations. Also, riders should be aware that a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) may retrospectively be applied for.

If you have a concern about doping, however small it may seem, you can contact UKAD direct. UKAD would like to know who is involved (can include individuals or teams), what they are doing and why,

how they are doping, when and where it is happening and who they are obtaining the substances from. UKAD is constantly building its picture of doping in sport and your information could be just the detail UKAD needs.

## DEVELOPMENT OF THE SPORT

### Social Media

In the past 12 months (October 2016-October 2017) CTT, with the help of its social media managers Snowdon Sports, has further increased its coverage on some of the major social media platforms:

#### Facebook

The total number of people following us on Facebook has increased by 31 per cent (5754 to 7570).

The number of times one of our reports has appeared on someone's Facebook timeline has increased by 45 per cent (1,073,097 to 1,558,084).

The number of times someone clicked a link on Facebook to go to the CTT website and read a report increased by 56 per cent, while the number of times someone clicked like, commented or shared one of our Facebook posts has increased by 50 per cent.

## Twitter

The total number of people following us on Twitter has increased by 16 per cent (5262 to 6143).

Interestingly, while the number of times we have posted has remained largely the same this year, the number of times someone has 'liked' one of our Twitter posts has increased 87 per cent.

## Videos

In addition to social media, CTT has continued to commission and publish professional videos of our national championships and other high profile events throughout the year and placed these on the major video sharing platform You Tube, and these are also then promoted through our social media outlets.

## National Youth Championship

In 2017, the decision was taken to 'rebrand' the GHS Championship as the National Youth Championship (for the GHS Trophy). It was felt the new title would make it clear to riders new to the sport of its purpose, and would also increase awareness and participation. This initiative appears to have been successful.

## Scholarship

During 2017, the Scholarship gave support to Hetty Niblett and Jake Coward. Ben McIntosh was offered assistance but unfortunately was unable to accept. CTT is very grateful for the positive feedback and their rider blogs which have appeared periodically on the website throughout the season.

## Website ([www.ctt.org.uk](http://www.ctt.org.uk))

The current website has been running since March 2016 and the site has seen many upgrades over the past year thus improving the user experience and reporting.

The site requires individuals to register to use its facilities. Currently the website is showing over 21,000 registrations.

The site is "Role" based with different roles being able to perform different functions. The main roles are: rider (normal), organiser, district official and club official.

Normal users can enter or withdraw from events and maintain their own profile area, including the ability to choose what level of privacy they require. They receive automatic email notification of acceptance/rejection to events as well as notification of the publication of start and result sheets. Start and result sheets can be downloaded and printed off as a PDF document.

Organisers can manage their events, accept (after the closing date) or reject entrants, upload start and result sheets direct to the site and email entrants with a link where they can download full start and result sheets. It is also possible to email the entrants with any other information.

The new website also has the facility to recognise if a rider has entered more than one event on the same day in contravention of Regulation 11(e)

If an event is cancelled, organisers can arrange through admin for entrants to receive a full or partial refund.

District users are able to add/amend new events, courses, course maps and clubs.

Club officials can pay the club's annual affiliation and/or the advertising fee online via card payment. When payment is made online district officials are informed of the payment by email. If a club was previously shown as having advertising this element will need to be paid before they can be accepted and after 1 January the £20 re-joining fee.

A number of updates have been made including: Competition Records, Past Champions' information and BBAR competitions. The Champion of Champions has been running in the background this year and will be automated during 2018, as will the RTTC Classic Series (Knight Composites Classic Series).

CTT continues to expand its communication to the different roles listed above, subject to their permissions, by electronic means.

Outside of the website, CTT uses a system which holds a number of fixes and developments to the system. These are reviewed frequently for progress and new items are added as appropriate.

## Online affiliation

The ability for clubs to pay for their affiliation and advertising fees, if appropriate, became available via the website in 2016. At the moment this is limited to card payments, but CTT is looking at extending this to other payment methods. In the first year 343 clubs affiliated online representing 22% of those currently affiliated and, of those, 142 carried advertising. It is noticeable that many new clubs are using this facility.

## Numbers

New sets of race numbers (1-150) have been available at a discounted price of £50 (for clubs that have not taken advantage of this offer) with the normal cost price of a set of numbers of this quality being £150. A box of 1000 pins can also be supplied at an additional cost of £10. Seventeen clubs have included a set of numbers with their signs "Starter Pack" purchase and a further nine clubs have purchased a number set.

## Closed Circuit Events

Following on from the success of the Cycling Time Trials supported closed circuit events held during the 2016 season, a further series of events using the Croft Motor Racing Circuit in North Yorkshire, was completed in 2017. Using the principle of "getting backsides on saddles", organising the series was to

bring the sport of time trialling to a wider audience in an endeavour to increase participation in both club and open events.

The series, marketed as “Come & Try It” events, was targeted at families and cyclists who had not ridden time trials previously. Advertising consisted, as last year, of posters being displayed in local cafés and cycle shops, as well as on a number of club websites (including the CTT website). In addition, this year the events were advertised on several cycling orientated Facebook pages. As a result, riders were drawn from a much wider geographical area.

As many closed circuit events are run as Type B events, the Board isn’t necessarily aware of which clubs organise time trials on closed circuits or which circuits are used. The Board is however aware of a number of very successful events held on closed circuits and under CTT rules and regulations, including the Bicester Millennium CC annual 9-up team time trial around Silverstone Motor Racing Circuit. In Midland District, for the first time Rugby RCC organised a successful team time trial round Mallory Park Circuit and Hinckley CRC have run training events at the same venue. A number of time trials are promoted using the Castle Combe Circuit. Rockingham race track in Northamptonshire has

been used by a number of clubs. Worcester St Johns use the famous Shelsey Walsh motor racing hill climb, which for 2018 will be home to the RTTC National Championship hill climb.

Finally, there is of course the RTTC closed circuit National Championship which again was held at Thrupton Racing Circuit. This event continues to grow in popularity and in 2017 attracted 303 entries, including a GBR hand-cyclist.

It is apparent that there is a developing enthusiasm amongst riders for this type of event. CTT is keen to support further development of closed circuit events and the Board is willing to discuss any opportunities that could be embraced.

### Electronic start and result sheets

The majority of start and result sheets are sent electronically, these are submitted to the website in the correct format and are usually published within 24 hours. Paper entries are added to the system manually.

Many organisers have been ‘coached’ through the process as part of an educational drive. The process can be viewed through a link on the website where there are tutorials to ‘walk’ them through the systems. A number of amendments have been



introduced around the system to ensure ease of use. A testing area is to be introduced where organisers can use 'dummy' data to trial the system prior to their 'live' event.

All literature submitted to the website must still comply with Regulation 27 (e) and (j) and **MUST** include the words "**Promoted for and on behalf of Cycling Time Trials under their Rules and Regulations**".

***In order to comply with insurance requirements this wording must be included.***

Complete copies of both the start and result sheets can also be added to the website. Organisers should use the built-in email facility 'contact entrants' to inform riders how they can download the complete copy. **However, a complete copy of both the start and result sheet must be sent to the relevant district official, along with full details of the event, ie timekeepers, course, HQ, etc.** Copies of start and results sheets can be downloaded and printed from the website.

**In order to comply with the data protection principles, start and result sheets should be sent to riders using the email "BCC" (blind copy) function in order not to disclose the email addresses of other recipients. Details sent to riders from the website are sent individually. No attachments should contain personal information (eg addresses, telephone numbers, date of birth, etc).**

### **Workshops/Conferences**

A total of 46 delegates attended a friendly and informative Organisers' Workshop held on 11 February 2017. Topics covered included event payment via internet entry, internet entry start and result sheets, the Organisers' Portal, doping control, "on the day" risk assessments and accident reporting. The feedback following the workshop was extremely positive. Many who attended said the knowledge gained increased their confidence and would encourage them to promote events in the future.

A District Secretaries' and Treasurers' meeting was held on 11 March 2017 with all of CTT's 22 districts represented. Topics covered included accident reports and 2016 statistics, the CTT website, Gold badge/Certificate of Honour criteria, anti-doping, National Championships, disciplinary procedure and handbook production/ information deadlines. Again, all those who attended found this an extremely useful and informative day.

### **CYCLING TIME TRIALS HANDBOOK**

This year, a copy of the handbook again was issued free of charge to all affiliated clubs and all event organisers, this will be the same for 2018.

The cover price for 2018 will increase to £10 with postage and packaging at £2 per copy. There will be a 50p per copy discount on **all orders received before 31 December 2017**. These will be dispatched direct from the printer (Geerings Print Ltd) in mid-January 2018. Orders received after this date will not receive the discount.

With more riders using internet entry and full details of the majority of events being available on the CTT website, the total distribution of the handbook has fallen to approximately 4000.

### **CHAMPIONS NIGHT**

The fabulous facilities at Heythrop Park, Enstone, Oxfordshire were the centre for this special RTTC Gala Evening & Prize Presentation, organised largely by Alison Torode, ably assisted by Board members of Cycling Time Trials, their families and friends to whom we give a huge vote of thanks. We were delighted to have Michael Hutchinson with us in his role of Master of Ceremonies and he welcomed the Chairman, Sheila Hardy, and chief guest Tony Gibb, to the stage. In a short speech, the Chairman welcomed everyone to the full auditorium. This year we were privileged to have Tony Gibb, Eurosport commentator, professional cyclist and owner of Full Gas Bikes at Stocksbridge as our principal guest. Tony was a great hit with prize winners of all ages as he welcomed them all to the stage with enthusiasm and interest in each of their performances. In his speech, Tony shared some interesting insights into his racing career where he is still very active, particularly on the track and also into his commentating roles on Eurosport. 'Sail' banners depicting our Champions of Champions graced the stage along with some very special bikes provided by Full Gas Bikes. We were also very pleased to welcome representatives of the late Vic Clarke, Brian Jones and Gail Summerlin who generously presented the RTTC Trophy Trustees with trophies for various competitions, where previously none had existed. A special 'guest' at the evening was the enormous International 50 trophy which proved to be of great interest to many of those attending who took the opportunity to look at it at close quarters. During the dinner, the Chairman presented a special award to Hayley Simmonds who, during the season, had become the first lady to break the 30mph barrier at 25 miles which was a real milestone. Tony Gibb made himself freely available to chat to all present during the evening which was appreciated by all the guests as they mingled together after dinner in the Ballroom. Thanks were also given to Geerings Print who support CTT during the year, producing the Cycling Time Trials handbook, pre-orders of which were available for collection at the event.

## SCOTLAND DISTRICT

The new CTT Scotland District has proved to be very successful and active. During 2017, around 80 cycling clubs affiliated to CTT with the vast majority of South, West and Central Scottish clubs now affiliated. The number of events promoted in Scotland under CTT Rules and Regulations continues to increase and, in particular, there are a number of “high profile” events to be promoted in 2018, to include the RTTC National Championship 10 miles. Thanks are due to the myriad of selfless volunteers who keep ‘the machine’ moving forward and for the enthusiasm and participation of all the riders. A number of Scottish records were achieved at “CTT Scotland” events this year and these are currently being processed. Scotland District looks forward to presenting the riders with their deserved accolades and certificates soon and properly recording their times for posterity.

## COURSE MEASUREMENT AND RISK ASSESSMENT

Safety is paramount for course measurers and with this in mind, former CTT director, Steve Walker, offered his professional expertise to CTT to produce a system that would keep course measurers safer. Steve has spent most of his professional life measuring roads for Ordnance Survey; his understanding and use of suitable systems could work well for CTT. The ‘wheel’ will always have a place in our sport, but other options must be explored and with this in mind, Jeff Bowler and Steve Walker have worked together with the Chairman, to produce a workshop which they hope to take round the country to perhaps four or five venues. Risk assessment will also be included in this workshop, but we are sure you will appreciate that work like this takes time to produce and that is what has been happening during the 2017 season. Everyone with an interest in course measuring whether currently carrying out the task, or new to the role, will be welcome. **Dates will be announced early in the new year.**

## HS2 TRAIN

The Chairman made contact with senior staff at HS2 and accompanied by Nick Sharpe, Sheila Hardy attended a meeting at their Head Office in Birmingham. The concern expressed by CTT representatives was not just about where the route of the train would run, but the effects and impact the construction of the route would have on the surrounding roads and lanes as large machinery was moved around the countryside as it is built. It was comforting to hear them say that they welcomed our interest and assured us of their support moving forward to 2019 when they expected things to really be happening out in the countryside.

## REGULATION 14(d)(ii)

This rule was written around 1997 when the ‘superman’ position had become widely used and was deemed unsafe. With the change of riding styles, bikes and equipment, the rule did not fit the current need. It was extremely hard to enforce and a great deal of discussion took place around the Boardroom table as to how to take it forward. There is little evidence of the ‘superman’ position amongst current riders and after carrying out investigation at various events the Board decided to put a moratorium on this rule during the 2017 season to give themselves time to consider, and also to see if there really was still a need for it. Three experts have been consulted by the Chairman and three Board members. All professionals have different perspectives on the issue. It is clear that there is no “quick fix”. This work will continue into 2018 as it is essential that the right decision is made.

## POLICE SAFETY ADVISORY GROUP

A number of districts have worked with their local police forces to broker better relationships with them for time trials. This has helped considerably when there have been issues with major motorway networks, or long running roadworks. Midland District has worked particularly closely with Warwickshire and West Midlands Police, Highways Agencies and Local Authorities and it has proved to be a worthwhile process, and meeting two or three times a year as a group, the relationships generated mean that if there is any issue before, during, or after an event, it is quickly addressed and dealt with.

## NATIONAL RANKING SYSTEM

The ranking system, proposed by the special working group in 2015, has during the 2017 season been established and working in the background on the CTT website. The points based system is ready for launch in the 2018 season. There is a separate hill climb ranking system that is being populated as hill climb results are received. This will continue to work in the background and be available for the 2018 hill climb season. Further details of the ranking system will be provided early in the new year.

### Champion of Champions Competitions Ron Kitching Trophy

By winning the 10, 25, 50 and Circuit Championships (only 3 events to count), Dan Bigham took the overall honours from Matthew Smith with team mate Brett Harwood in 3rd.

### Chris Boardman Trophy

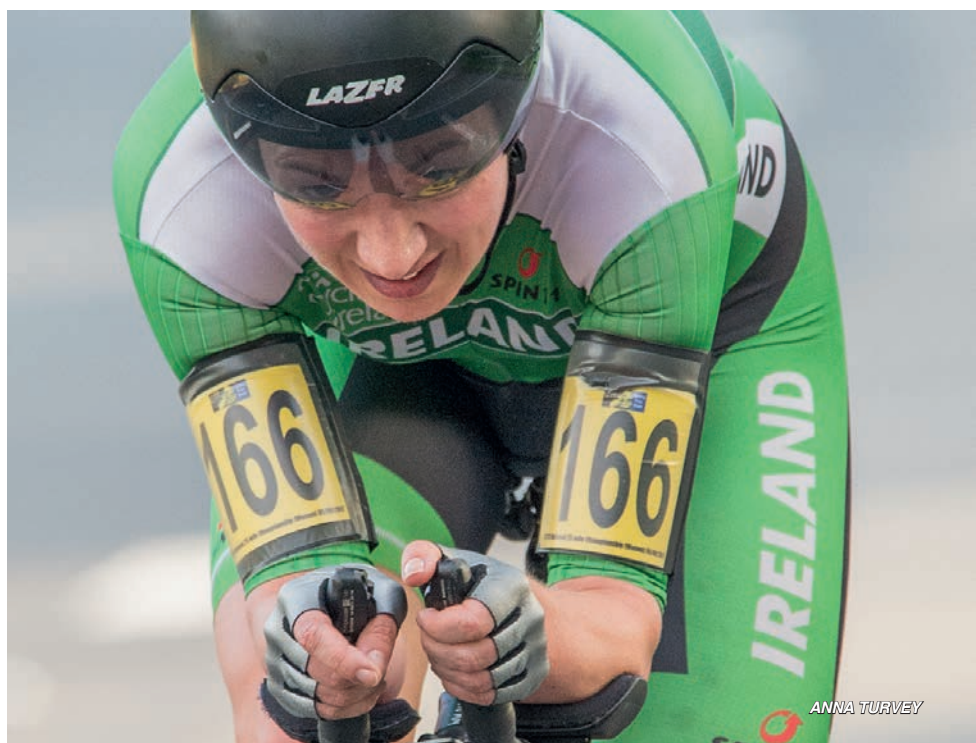

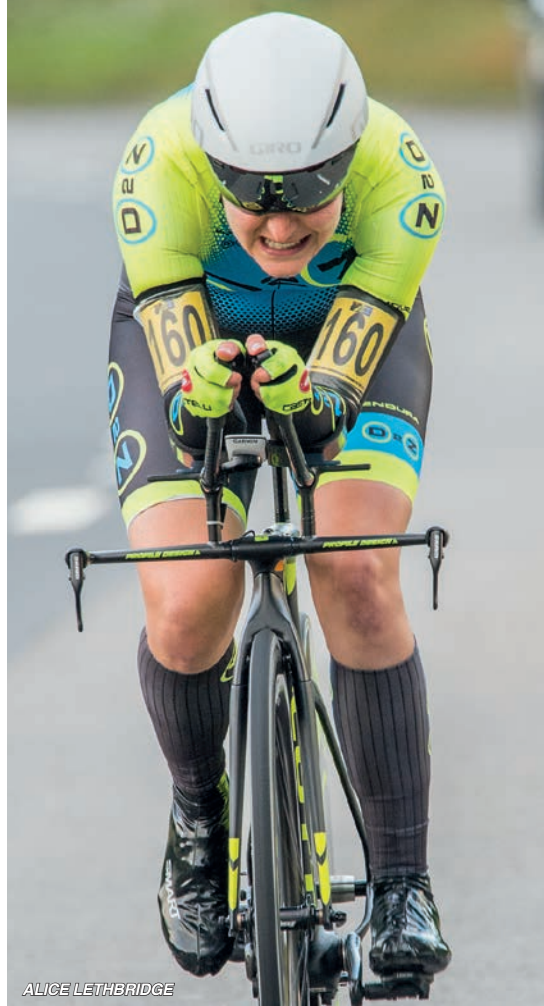
