## The course - V714

Start on B1230 in Gilberdyke 5 miles east of Howden Traffic Island at a point approx. 110 yards east of Gilberdyke service station at painted mark at end of lane. Proceed westwards on B1230 to turn at Howden Traffic Island. retrace through Gilberdyke to finish at tp 107/31-60 15 yards past car park entrance to white horse inn (Gilberdyke).

The V714 is a simple out to the roundabout and back course. Its a little shorter on the way out (4.6 miles) and is flat (except for 2 flyovers) with a pretty good surface. The start is located approximately one mile west of the village hall.

## Time Trial Etiquette

- Riders are set off at one min intervals and aim to complete
  the course as quickly as they can. Your time is worked out by
  the finish timekeeper and displayed on the result board in
  the HQ
- If you are caught by another rider, or if you catch another rider, you are not allowed to ride together (or draft in their slipstream).
- You must stick to the rules of the road and the highway code.
   Marshalls and signs are used to direct you around the course but the roads are still open to traffic in the usual way.
