





CRICH MEMORIAL STAND

In 1921 it was decided that some lasting memorial should be erected to the memory of the 11,409 men mainly from Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire, of the Sherwood Foresters Regiment, who had lost their lives in the Great War and on 6th August 1921 the new Memorial Tower was dedicated. In 1939 the Sherwood Foresters again found themselves on active service and in 1952 the Memorial was re-dedicated to the memory of the 1,520 Sherwood Foresters who died in WW2. In 1970 the Sherwood Foresters amalgamated with the Worcestershire Regiment to become the Worcestershire and Sherwood Foresters Regiment. In 2007 the Regiment was absorbed into the Mercian Regiment and became the 2nd Battalion The Mercian Regiment (Worcesters and Foresters). The Memorial now recognises all from the above regiments, who have given their lives in conflicts around the world.
