The Story:

Nichols needs a bigger mug tree, the golden oldies show the youngsters how it's done and 'Jimmy The Blade' DOESN'T set a record.

Against the back drop of a perfect summers evening and copious amounts of Neck Oil Pale Ale, the 13th edition of the Circuit of Longstone Edge time trial proved to be lucky for some, but not if you first name begins with James and your second name begins with McKay.

On a course which combines challenging climbs with super-fast duel carriageway, the question of whether to ride a TT or a road bike is something which has vexed many a competitor in the past. James 'Jimmy the Blade' McKay (Cycle Sheffield) had no such doubts as he muscled his road bike to the overall fastest time of the evening with a fine 41.58. Fast – but no cigar – as his time was 1 second shy of the record held by Jude Taylor (Team PB Performance). Taylor, the 2022 winner, had to settle for 2nd place this year with 42.21, but one can't help feel that the second placed man felt more like a winner on the night.

While McKay failed spectacularly in his quest to set a record time, super-vet Kevin White representing Matlock CC made no mistake. Flying around the course to third place in 45.18, White not only added to his burgeoning collection of '45s', he also removed 33 seconds from the record he himself set just 2 years previously. At the ripe old age of 54 White could be excused for going slower, but his advancing years seem to be making him quicker.

The fastest female was race newcomer Lucy Neatham who stopped the clock at 51.40. Neatham's time may be nearly 6 minutes slower than Hayley Simmonds' outrageous record, but it was a sensational debut nonetheless where experience of the course tends to yield quicker times. The second placed rider, however, did set a new benchmark and once again it was a veteran rider showing the youngsters how to break a record. Rachel Singleton from Belper BC shaved 3 seconds from Jo Jebb's mark with a time of 54.46 and, with
