Kara, the first winner of the Mick Gray Trophy, will be presented with her trophy at the annual Wyre Forest CRC awards night later this year.

Cash prizes were awarded on the basis of one prize per rider, with the higher value prize being awarded first. As we had only four ladies racing and the value of the prize for 1st vet on standard was higher than 3rd place rider, Gemma Johnson should have been awarded with 1st vet on standard in lieu of 3rd placed female. This was rectified after the initial prize giving, and Gemma has very kindly requested for her additional prize fund to be donated to a charity of the club's choosing.

And finally...

Thank you to everybody who raced on Saturday. The weather conditions were less than ideal and we had been prepared to cancel the event at short notice if we felt the conditions were dangerous. We did take special precautions on the descent into Severn Stoke, which is tricky at the best of times but was made worse by a damp road surface on the day, and the threat of heavier rain in the morning. Fortunately the weather conditions were kinder than originally anticipated and although it was windy we did not feel the conditions posed a danger to riders. That said, I do have admiration for the handful of riders who were brave enough to tackle the course with a disc wheel!

Part of the reason for pushing ahead despite a large number of DNS's on an already very small field was due to the fact that it was the first race we had held since the passing of Mick Gray last year. Whilst we would have hoped for a larger field, it was very fitting to hold this race on the last course that Mick himself raced in 2018, at the age of 83! Mick has always acted as recorder at our open events since I started organising them in 2018, and was incredibly helpful and supportive from the very first event. It was a honour and a privilege to have known him, and I am hopeful we will have more riders at our next event.
