<u>Parking is limited at the HQ</u> so please cycle or car share if possible. Please park along Whitecross Road and show consideration to local residents and do not block entrances to driveways.

## Important notes:

- No warming up on the course after the first rider has started
- Please sign the official start sheet at the HQ at least 30 minutes before your start. Please do not forget to sign out after your race or you will be registered as 'DNF'.
- Please allow 10 minutes to get from the HQ to the start. Proceed up Middle Street. Carry on past Culver Lane and Barn End. The course starts before the junction to Wallace Lane.
- No U-turns are permitted near the start or finish (within sight of the timekeepers!)
- Please shout your number as you cross the finish line
- A hard shell helmet and working front & rear lights are compulsory

## Course details: UH91 – Smithams Chimney (1.2 miles / 1.9km)

The course starts beyond the last house in the village, before the junction for Wallace Lane. Beside a road gully and telegraph pole (there should be a white line painted on the road).

The gradient increases gradually until you reach the snaking turns, where it ramps up to around 16% for a hundred metres. To add to the difficulty the road surface is particularly poor here. Once through the twists and turns you reach a plateau with beautiful views across the Chew Valley. Something to look forward to on the way back down! After this respite, the road kicks up for the final climb to the summit. Come out of the woods and continue to the crest of the hill, beside a clump of short trees. Again, there should be a white line painted on the road. Approximate route is on Strava as "Smitham Chimney Hill Climb" www.strava.com/segments/17064780
