START on A1060 at western edge of drain adjacent to TP260 which is 210 yards west of Lordship Road (approximately 2.5 miles west of Chelmsford). Proceed along A1060 through Margaret Roding to Leaden Roding (M) (6.85m). Turn right **WITH GREAT CARE** onto B184 and continue through High Roding to turn around a small roundabout at Clapton Hall Lane (M) (12.6m). Retrace through High Roding and Leaden Roding (M) (18.35m), turn along A1060 through Margaret Roding to FINISH opposite 7th diagonal white line after traffic island past 'Pet Clinic'.



Note: Start is about 2 miles from Race HQ – see map for details.

Course Risk Assessment & Rider Notes

Because of parked cars you should take extreme care when passing through High Roding village. Be advised that the turn at Clapton Hall Lane is a very tight roundabout and can be slippery if wet.

At all roundabouts riders must give a clear signal as to their intended route and give way to traffic from the right.

Any rider passing to the right of the painted circle at Leaden Roding mini roundabout will be disqualified from the event and reported to the District Secretary for consideration of disciplinary action. Please remember marshals are stationed at junctions for your safety but they are not responsible for directing traffic or indicating if the junction is clear.

Riders are reminded that no competitor shall be allowed to start an event unless they are wearing a **HARD SHELL SAFETY HELMET** that meets an internationally accepted safety standard.

Riders are also reminded that no competitor shall be allowed to start an event unless such competitor has affixed to the rear of their machine a working rear red light and affixed to the front of their machine a working front white light; lights to be illuminated, either flashing or constant, and in a position that is clearly visible to other road users.

Road Bike Rules

Please note that for the 2024 season the rules regarding helmet choice for the road bike category have changed.

To qualify for the road bike category you must not wear a helmet that covers the ears.

Full road bike regulations printed below for your reference...

- 29. Road Bike Criteria (Moved from Regulation 14, 14l Section: Competitors)
- (a) The road bike can possess drop or straight handlebars; no tri-bars, clip-on bars or Spinaci bars are allowed; no disc wheels; both front & rear wheels must have at least 12 spokes each; the maximum rim depth allowed is 90mm
- (b) Helmets used in Road Bike category events must not cover the ears or have a teardrop/pointy style "tail", any helmet vents must not be covered or blocked. The helmet must not have been altered or had any element added or removed in terms of design or form but may be used as the manufacturer intended (e.g., sliding vents). It is prohibited to add a detachable cover to a helmet. The composition of the helmet material and its surface condition are not subject to any regulations. However, additions to the helmet are not allowed (cover, tape etc.).
- N.B. For competitors riding Road Bikes, competitors must predominantly ride holding the drops or brake hoods. Riders may not ride in the "Puppy Paws" Position or simulate a Tri-Bar position by resting the forearms on the handlebars.

Plenty of parking is available in the Waterhouse Lane Car Park, there is no charge for parking on Sundays. Please note there is no parking at the start. Riders will need to ride from HQ.

Body numbers will be available at the Event HQ and must be personally signed for after reading any special course instructions.


All competitors are reminded to personally sign the signing-out sheet when returning their number, otherwise they may be recorded as DNF



Drinks & cakes will be available after the event, tea & coffee will be free of charge but cakes will be £1.50 each. Cash & card accepted.

Route from HQ to course

The ride from HQ to the start should take no longer than 10 minutes. Signs will be provided. There is plenty of opportunity to warm up along Lordship Road and Cow Watering Lane, both very close to the start.



IMPORTANT: Possible Roadworks / Backup Course

There are currently temporary traffic lights on the course near the turn at Clapton Hall Lane. The roadworks are scheduled to be complete before the event commences but if there are delays it will require the event to be moved to an alternative course. The E83/25 "Vipers" course has been reserved as a backup should this occur. The decision to move will be taken on the morning of the 20th April and communicated to all riders via email. **Please ensure that you check your emails accordingly**. It is a 9 mile ride from HQ to the start of the backup course. Alternatively, after signing on you can drive to Mountnessing Village Hall where there is ample parking and a short ride to the start.

Handicapping by Spindata (www.spindata.co.uk)

Spindata is a system for ranking time trial results across the UK by using time and relative position to others. Spindata has been developed to recognise the achievements of all riders, whatever their ability. The Spindata algorithm generates a predicted time for an event using a rider's past riding history, course and weather conditions. This predicted time will be used as your handicap for the event. If you have not ridden sufficient events to generate a predicted time, you will not be eligible to compete in the handicap category. Predicted times will be published on Wednesday 17th April.

Time Trial HQ is a revolutionary new timing system built in partnership between the Shaftesbury Cycling Club and HCS Technologies Ltd. The system provides tablet based timing solutions for time trials with real time calculation of split times & results, all published back to HQ for display on a live results board.
